One Minute Editorial - A moment of silence for those who mock electric vehicles?

Fossil fuel companies have wasted no time in taking advantage of yet another geo-political catastrophe while piling-on more nonsensical excuses to jack up the price of fuel around the World. Executives at BP were quoted recently saying "we are making so much money we don't know what to do with it". Are they in fact digging their own graves with their greed? Canada has a glut of domestically produced oil, can't get it to international markets for lack of transportation pipelines, and has imported little or no Russian oil in living memory. And yet as profits soar across the industry, Canadian consumers are getting fleeced one more time. I took the photo at left in Langford on Thursday May 19th. At this price, a gas car burning 10 liters per 100 kilometers will cost owners \$58.25 for the 250km round trip from Nanaimo to Victoria. An electric car using up 45kWh worth of electrons (at 12 cents per kWh) for the same trip will cost the EV owner \$5.40

With their "business as usual", the fossil fuel industry looks to be a self-correcting problem? Happy motori
